JAM (Just A Minute) Session

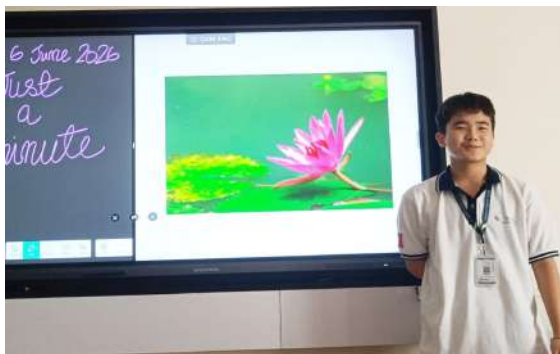

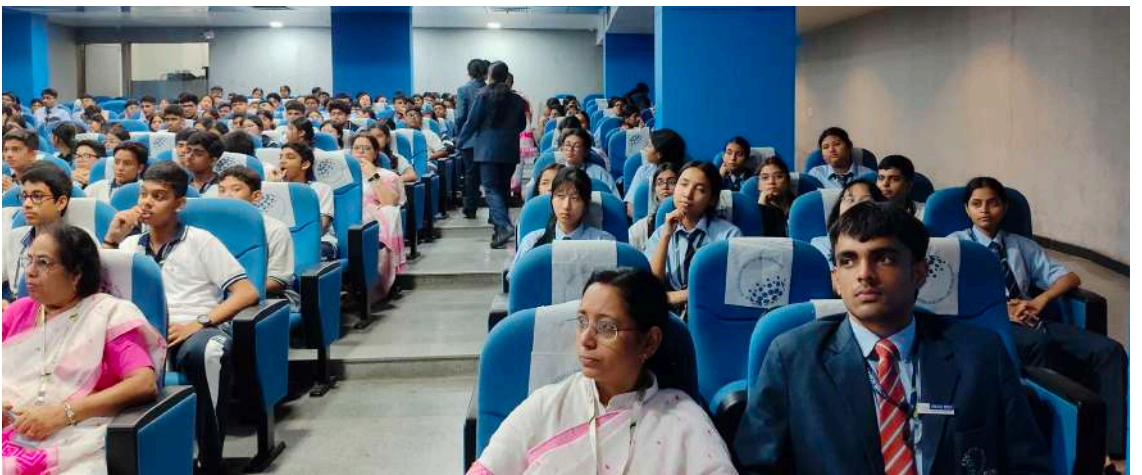

On 19 June 2026, students from Grades 1 to 5 celebrated Father's Day with creativity, warmth, and gratitude ahead of Sunday's special occasion.

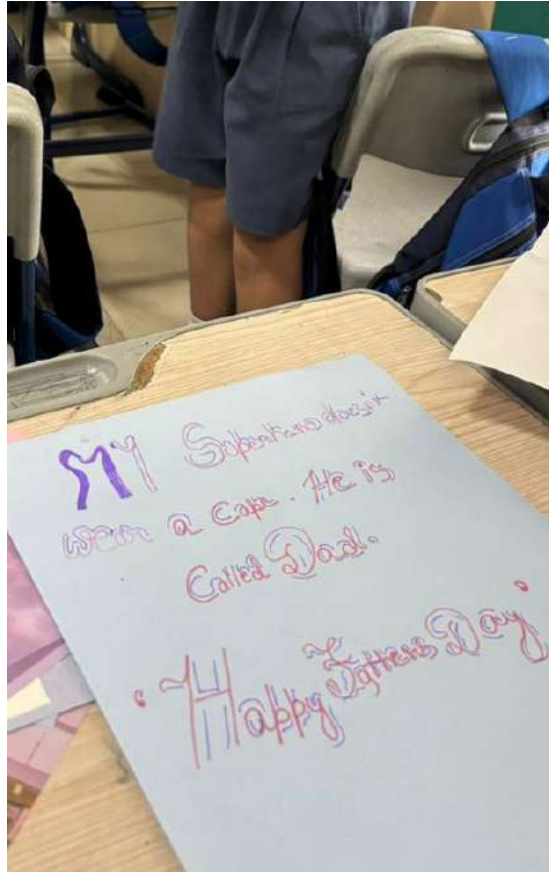

योग : आत्मोन्नति, आरोग्य और जीवन-संतुलन का महापर्व

रॉयल ग्लोबल स्कूल में अंतर्राष्ट्रीय योग दिवस 2026 का दिव्य एवं प्रेरणास्पद आयोजन

जब उदीयमान सूर्य की स्वर्णिम किरणें धरती को आलोकित कर रही थीं और प्रकृति नवचेतना के मधुर स्पर्श से पुलकित हो रही थी, तब रॉयल ग्लोबल स्कूल का प्रांगण योग, अनुशासन और आत्मिक ऊर्जा के अनुपम संगम का साक्षी बना। 12वें अंतर्राष्ट्रीय योग दिवस के पावन अवसर पर विद्यालय परिवार ने अद्वितीय उत्साह, समर्पण और सामूहिक चेतना के साथ योग की महान परंपरा का अभिनंदन किया। सम्पूर्ण परिसर स्वास्थ्य, सौहार्द, सकारात्मकता और आध्यात्मिक जागरण की दिव्य आभा से आलोकित हो उठा।

इस वर्ष का थीम “स्वास्थ्य आयु के लिए योग” (YOGA FOR HEALTHY AGEING) ने यह संदेश दिया कि योग केवल शारीरिक सुदृढ़ता का माध्यम नहीं, बल्कि जीवन की प्रत्येक अवस्था में संतुलन, प्रसन्नता, मानसिक दृढ़ता और आत्मिक परिष्कार का अमृत-स्रोत है। यह मानव को केवल दीर्घायु ही नहीं बनाता, अपितु जीवन को गरिमा, ऊर्जा और उद्देश्य से भी अनुप्राणित करता है।

विद्यालय के कुशल योग प्रशिक्षक श्री जयेश गोसाईं के प्रेरक मार्गदर्शन में विद्यार्थियों, शिक्षकों तथा प्रशासनिक कर्मचारियों ने विविध योगासन, प्राणायाम एवं सूर्य नमस्कार का अभ्यास अत्यंत एकाग्रता, श्रद्धा और अनुशासन के साथ किया। प्रत्येक आसन में निहित वैज्ञानिकता और आध्यात्मिकता ने प्रतिभागियों को आत्मानुशासन, धैर्य तथा अंतर्मन की शांति का अनुभव कराया।

प्रातःकालीन वातावरण योग-मंत्रों की मंगलमयी ध्वनियों से गुंजायमान हो उठा। सैकड़ों साधकों द्वारा एक साथ किए गए समन्वित योगाभ्यास ने ऐसा मोहक दृश्य उपस्थित किया मानो स्वास्थ्य और सामंजस्य की एक जीवंत सरिता सम्पूर्ण परिसर में प्रवाहित हो रही हो। शरीर की लय, मन की स्थिरता और आत्मा की निर्मलता का यह अद्भुत समन्वय योग के वास्तविक स्वरूप—‘एकत्व’—की साकार अभिव्यक्ति प्रतीत हो रहा था।

Meanwhile, her husband, portrayed by Manish Chaudhari, entertains the men by ridiculing his female boss for making him send what he calls a pointless email.

The divide is immediate. The men unwind in the living room with snacks, debating issues they know little about, while the women are confined to the stifling kitchen, handling all the cooking. Students quickly noted the clear split between 'guests' enjoying leisure and 'caretakers' performing labour.

Through restrained, character-led storytelling, *Juice* reveals how normalized gender roles shape everyday life. Manju's change isn't loud or dramatic. She reclaims control through a quiet, deliberate act. Her final, steely glare delivers a powerful statement: change doesn't require noise; silence can be equally piercing.

The film ended to enthusiastic applause from the class. Ghaywan's deft direction and the story's everyday relevance pushed students to reflect on gender dynamics in their own families and society, leaving them with a profound message about tradition, choice, and quiet resistance.



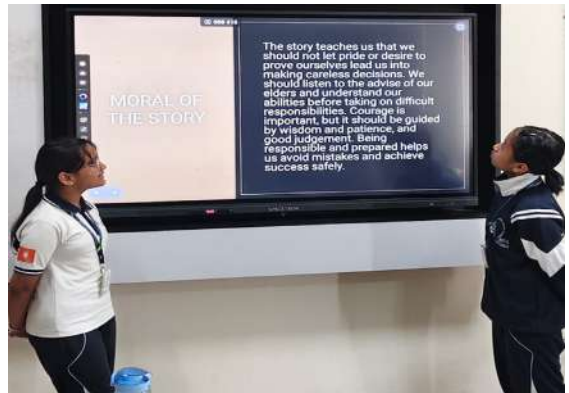
Exploring Mythology Through Creative Presentations

From Story Weaving to Magic Math: Primary Students Thrive on Hands-on Workshop Series

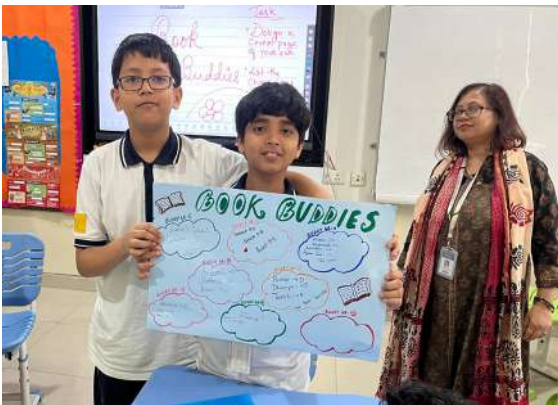

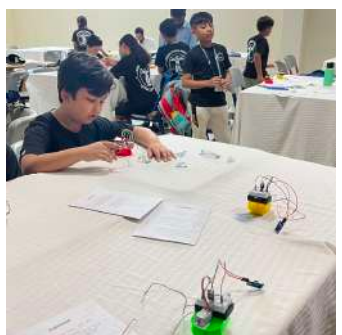
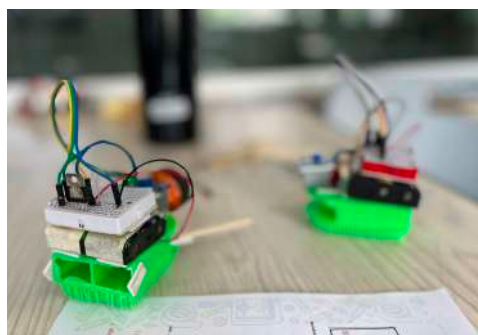
Royal Global School successfully hosted Royal MakerCamp from 29 June to 1 July 2026, a three-day hands-on STEM programme organised in collaboration with the Sparkbee Foundation, Cuwahati. Bringing together students from Grades III to XI, the camp provided an exciting opportunity to explore robotics, coding and game design through experiential learning.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Arup Kumar Mukhopadhyay, Director, Royal Global School, who encouraged students to nurture their curiosity, think creatively and embrace learning through exploration and collaboration. The camp was coordinated by Mr. Nabojyoti Gupta, STEM In-charge, whose meticulous planning ensured a rewarding experience for all participants. The event also witnessed enthusiastic participation from students of several schools, including participants from the United States and Canada, making the camp a truly diverse and international learning experience.

From First Circuits to Playable Games

Each day of the camp built deliberately on the last. On the first day, students assembled photovore robots — simple light-seeking machines that introduced the fundamentals of sensors and circuits. On the second day, participants advanced to building line-follower robots and, in a separate module, wiring voice-controlled Bluetooth systems that allowed them to operate LED bulbs and motors from a mobile phone. By the third day, students had moved from hardware to software, designing their own playable games in Roblox Studio and exploring Lua scripting to bring their ideas to life. The arc of the camp — from soldering a first circuit to scripting an interactive game — reflected its central aim: to show students that the tools behind everyday technology are well within their reach.

The overwhelming response from students and parents reaffirmed the value of experiential STEM education, making Royal MakerCamp 2026 a memorable celebration of creativity, innovation and hands-on learning.
