Flood Relief Mission to Sibsagar

On the evening of 1st August 2026, a relief team of educators, administrative staff, and support personnel from Royal Global School, along with the Social Outreach Club - Utsarga, set out to deliver flood relief materials to Sibsagar. The team was flagged off by the Head of Lower Primary, the Head of Wellness, and other staff members.

They carried survival kits for over 250 families, containing dry rations along with essentials like water-purifying bleach, Betadine, phenyl, children's medicines, mosquito nets and coils, disposable plates and cups, Electral, candles, sanitary pads, biscuits, and drinking water.

The first distribution was held at Santak Government LP School, sheltering 25 families from Nepali Kutti, one of the

worst-hit areas. The team listened to survivors' accounts of the night of 19th July 2026, then proceeded to Nazira, where homes lay buried in silt and people took shelter in petrol pumps, schools, and along roadsides.

Amid the devastation, a family that had lost everything to the floods was seen offering free tea to the relief workers—a moving gesture of gratitude that showed compassion can endure even in the darkest times.

The team wrapped up distribution around 3:00 p.m. on 2nd August 2026, having witnessed destruction far greater than anticipated—Sibsagar was not merely flood-affected, but flood-devastated. The team returned safely on 3rd August 2026, praying that such a calamity never recurs.





RGS Delegates Shine at SDG & ESD Conclave 2026 in Guwahati

Royal Global School proudly represented itself at the SDG & ESD Conclave 2026: Innovate, Unite and Transform – Businesses Shaping the Road to 2030, held at NEDFi House, Guwahati, on 2 August 2026. The school's delegation comprised five Grade 11 Commerce students - Naitik Patwary, Puneet Poddar, Ryan Borgohain, Longjam Anjali Chanu, and Abrar Ahamed, accompanied by Dr Karabi Das, Lead Economics Teacher.

Jointly organised by Maria's Public School and the WICCI Assam SDG Council, the conclave brought together young leaders and experts to discuss pressing global concerns such as Gender Equality, Education for Sustainable Development

(ESD), climate resilience, and sustainable business models. Through plenary discussions and interactive sessions, the delegates explored how local knowledge, youth empowerment, and ethical enterprise can advance the UN 2030 Agenda. They gained valuable insights into bridging gender disparities in STEM, aligning business practices with ecological needs, and localising ESD through grassroots advocacy within school communities.

The experience reaffirmed Royal Global School's commitment to fostering global citizenship, environmental stewardship, and leadership among its students.





Navigating New Career Horizons: A Guide for the Future-Ready Student

A Career Counselling Session was held at RGS on 5 August 2026 for students of Classes XI and XII, conducted by Mr Ajay Sharma, Director – Student Outreach, to help them navigate an evolving career landscape.

Mr Sharma revealed that by 2030, nearly 170 million new jobs are expected to emerge worldwide, even as technology transforms existing roles. He reminded students that career planning is an ongoing process, not a one-time decision, and stressed that skills such as critical thinking, communication, collaboration, creativity, digital literacy, emotional intelligence, and adaptability are now as vital as academic performance.

Students explored multidisciplinary fields beyond the traditional Science, Commerce, and Humanities streams including Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Cybersecurity, Design, and Entrepreneurship and learned that modern careers follow a "zigzag journey" rather than a straight line. Marksheets, they were told, are no longer the sole measure of success, with employers valuing innovation, leadership, and teamwork just as much.

The session ended with a lively Q&A on higher education and scholarships, and students also interacted with representatives from seventeen global universities, leaving them confident and inspired for the future.
